

Most Spanish-speaking immigrants living in our community experienced trauma in their home countries and during the harrowing journey to get here. Each one faces difficult challenges navigating a new life. They have little formal education, speak only Spanish or an indigenous language and need basic skills to counteract the consequences of poverty.

They come to Canal Alliance for help, bringing intelligence, a tremendous work ethic, unflinching perseverance and great passion for a better life.

Latinos make up 16% of Marin County's population,¹ approximately 42,000 residents.

Earning \$60,200/yr is considered low-income in Marin County.²
An average Spanish-speaking immigrant **household** in the Canal earns \$23,000.

78% of the Canal residents use a language other than English at home.

32% of Marin's Latino students graduated from high school collegeready, compared to 75% of white students.³
