

We began the year gearing up for a 2020 Census with a possible citizenship question. By the time we were ready to get out the count, the pandemic shut down all of our outreach plans for both the census and voter registration. Together we are facing obstacles to our civic engagement and advocacy efforts, and have adjusted our strategies to fit our changing world.

This is when civic engagement meets innovative thinking to create a silver lining.

We quickly changed our canvassing to phone banking and postcard mailing. Census and voter registration hotlines were set-up to safely help people over the phone. We piloted peer-to-peer text campaigns and reached out to our amazing volunteers to help us get out the count and get out the vote. We are committed to advocating for the rights of Latino immigrants and ensuring that their voices are heard.
