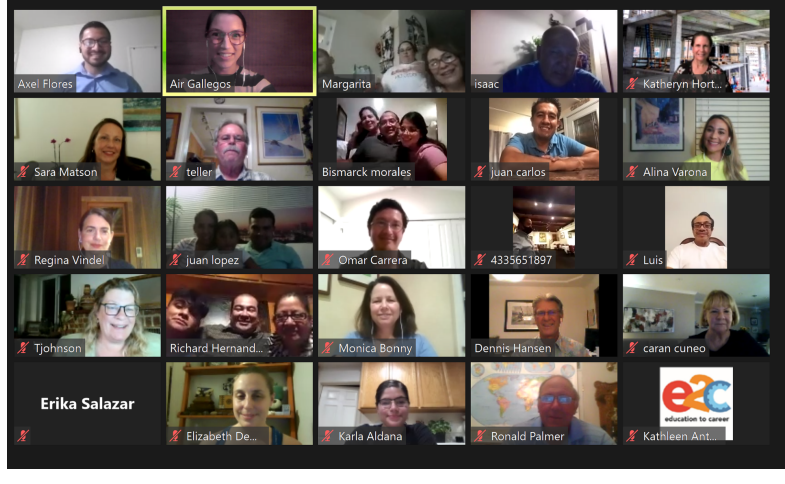
All of us on staff are encouraging one another to take care of ourselves, our families, our neighbors and our community during this challenging time. We hope that you will do the same.

Congratulations to our most recent Workforce Program graduates

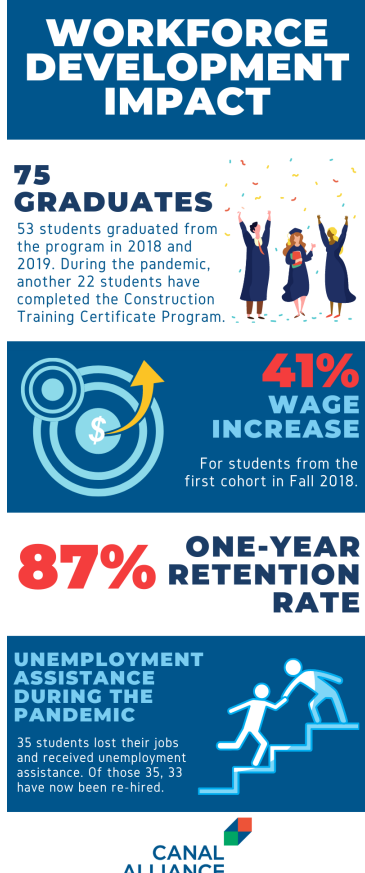
